

Luca Gonsalvi (Parma, Italy, 1968) obtained his Laurea Degree in Chemistry in 1994 at the University of Parma (Italy). From 1996 to 1999 he joined the group of Anthony Haynes and Peter M. Maitlis at the University of Sheffield (UK) as Ph. D. student, In December 1999, he moved to Delft University of Technology (NL) as Postdoctoral Research Associate to work with Roger A. Sheldon and Isabel W. C. E. Arends. In December 2001, he joined ICCOM CNR Florence (Italy) as Staff Researcher. Since 2010 he is Senior Researcher and Group Leader at ICCOM CNR. His research interests, centred on homogenous catalysis, include organometallic chemistry and catalysis in water, carbon dioxide activation and utilisation, hydrogen activation by precious and base transition metals. He has co-authored more than 100 articles on peer-reviewed journals, filed 1 patent and presented his work at more than 140 conferences and symposia, including Keynote and Plenary Lectures.
